Add: Between St George's Island and St David's Island, the Swing Bridge (also known as Mullet Bay Road Bridge) operates at Ferry Reach (the westernmost portion of St George's harbour with an air draft of 3.3m (10'10") at LAT. Swing Bridge operator VHF Ch 13.

Add: The port of St. George's is the main permanent YRC.

Add: Ordnance Island is unmistakable with its neat white mansion, Customs office and excellent public restrooms. The island is belted round with berthing, now collectively known as 'St George's Marina'. Berthing is managed by the well-established firm of Bermuda Yacht Services, run by Mark Soares. Alongside berthing or med moor style can accommodate yachts of all sizes. Overflow berthing is available to the west for vessels exceeding 100m LOA. But most yachts will be docked from Somers' and Hunter's wharves in the west, then moving east, Penno's Wharf, around Ordnance Island in its entirety, then east to Market Wharf. The southernmost wall of Ordnance Island was the cruise ship terminal and is where you'll usually find superyachts mooring med-style.Charges

In the event that visiting yachts are asked to pay the Lighthouse Tax, which is not always collected, the charge is now €15 for all of Portugal, which includes the Azores, Madeira and Porto Santo, regardless of the area being cruised. Keep the receipt as proof of payment in case you are asked for it at another port.

Page 54 Berthing Fees at Portos dos Açores SA marinas

Berthing fees have increased by about 5% since 1 January 2023, so a 12-15m yacht should cost in the region of €16.19 plus IVA (VAT) at 18% and a 4% residue charge.

Flores

Page 60 Porto das Lajes

Although there is still work ongoing on the harbour infrastructure at Lajes das Flores, it is now possible to visit this delightful little harbour. It is possible to anchor in the sheltered area of the harbour, and it may be possible to go alongside the wall in the old marina area, space permitting. Yachts should attempt to contact the harbour on VHF Channel 16, although this can be difficult.

Page 63 Hurricane Lorenzo

Lajes das Flores

There are ongoing works to repair the damage done to the harbour in September 2019, when Hurricane Lorenzo battered the island overnight, with 13m waves hammering the outer harbour wall, reducing it to rubble. The outer wall has been strengthened at its southern end and a new inner wall has been built. The outer wall is still to be rebuilt. Given these ongoing works, it is likely that yachts at anchor may be asked to leave at short notice if either works or conditions require it. The marina has not been reconstructed, but yachts may be allowed to lie alongside, with the Harbourmaster's permission. The Portuguese Avisos aos Navegantes (Notices to Mariners) advise that masters of vessels should proceed with caution. It would be inadvisable to attempt entry at night as the positions of the buoys are unreliable.

Page 67 Santa Cruz (Porto das Poças)

This small harbour, which has been considerably rebuilt, is not for visiting yachts but for ferries and fishing boats.

Horta

Page 84 Facilities

Showers: There are now two sets of showers servicing the marina. The new showers are situated along the sea front almost directly below Peter's Café-Sport. The old showers, at the northern end of the marina, have been refurbished (although already one of the sinks in the ladies' lavatories has been cracked) and are in much better condition than previously. The water pressure in higher than that in the new showers, and the water is hotter!

Pico

Page 86 Chartlet of Pico Island

Ponta da Ilha (the lighthouse at the eastern end of Pico Island) has new characteristics and should now read: Fl(2)20s29m20M

Page 92 São Roque do Pico

The characteristics of the light at the end of the breakwater have been changed to: Fl.G.3s12m12M

A yellow buoy Fl(5)Y.20s1M has been placed at position38°23′.972N 28°15′.721W.

The aerial view of the harbour at Calheta, taken from a commercial airplane, shows the positioning of the RoRo berth, the inner wall and the Museu Francisco de Lacerda at the head of the bay.

Terceira

Page 122 Angra do Heroísmo

Following the decision to build a RoRo berth in Porta das Pipas, there has been a considerable change to the harbour entrance at the Marina de Angra do Heroísmo and care should be taken when entering. The eastern harbour wall has been lengthened by about 100m and as work is still ongoing it would not be prudent to attempt a night entry, but rather go to anchor and wait until marina office hours (08:00 in the summer months). The photograph indicates the length of the new wall. There are a number of buoys marking the navigable passage into the marina. The layout of the marina pontoons is changing, too, and provision made for several 15m berths to the east (right) of the marina office. The marina office personnel will direct you to a suitable berth.

The reception dock is now a solid wall outside the marina office, which can be seen on the left of the photograph. It is much wider than the previous reception pontoon. Additionally the fuel berth is no longer operated by the

marina staff but by private enterprise, details of which can be obtained from the marina office.

The travel hoist dock is now closer to the head of the small bay at Porta das Pipas, but there is still plenty of depth there, around 4m. As usual, make arrangements withthe marina if you require a lift.

The new large ships' berth in Angra do Heroísmo



Page 124 Approach and Entrance

The new roro berth has now been completed and a cruise ship has recently tied up alongside the wharf. Care should be taken when entering the marina.

There are new berths for yachts of 12m and more to the east of the marina. Yachts should tie up to the visitor pontoon in front of the marina office before being directed to a berth or to anchor if there is no room.

The light at Porto das Pipas is now at 38°38′.99N 27°12′.92W. The characteristics remain the same.

Page 129 Praia da Vitória

The pontoons at the municipality-owned marina are reported to be in a rather sad condition and there are concerns about the continuance of the marina and hardstanding facilities. Nothing has been decided as yet and for this year it is business as usual.

In 2023 a number of owners arrived in Terceira to have their boats taken out of the water only to be told that it had been decided to leave the marquees in place for at least a month longer. It was unfortunate that a severe storm blew the marquees down a little while later.
